

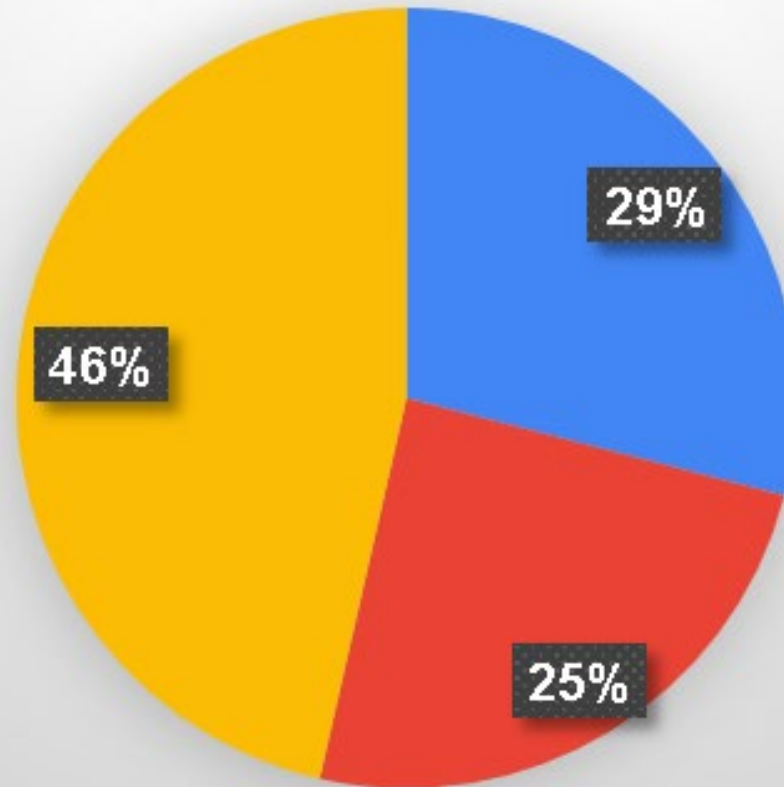

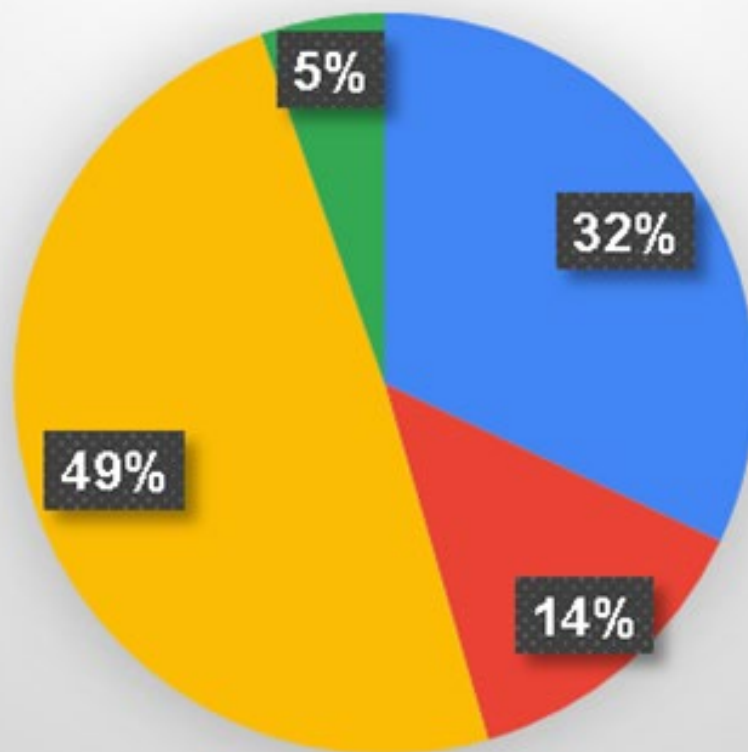

1. How long have you lived in River Crossing?



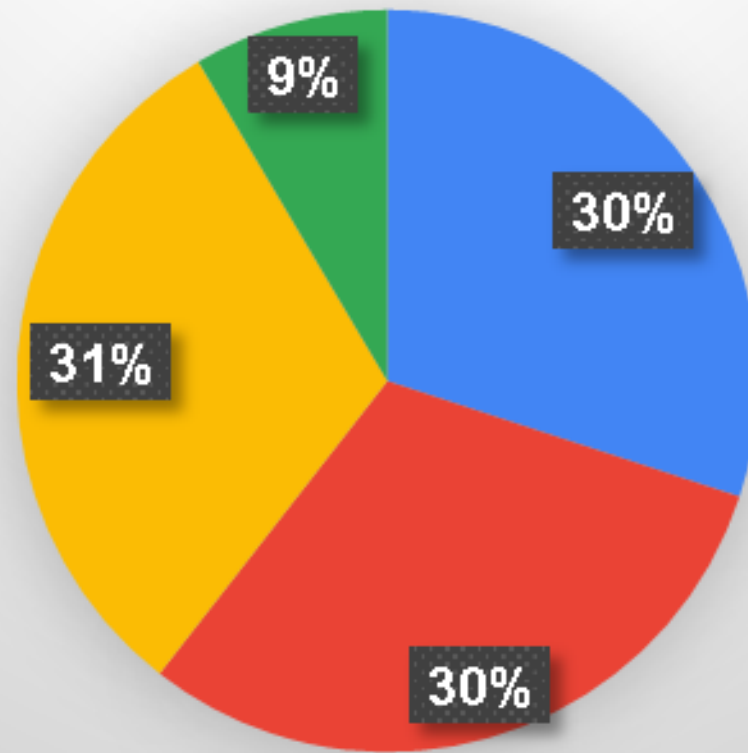

2. During the time that you have lived here, it is your impression that the white-tailed deer population has...



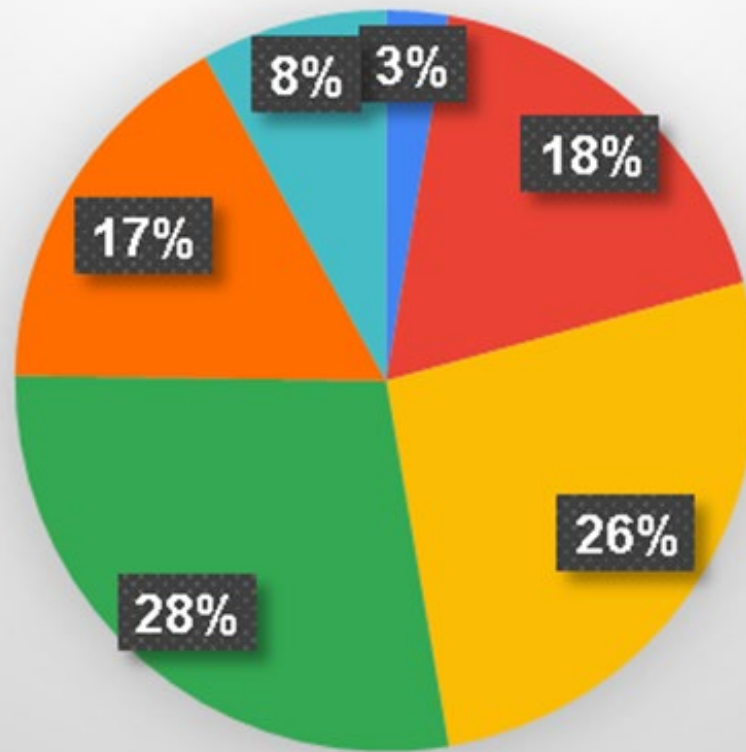

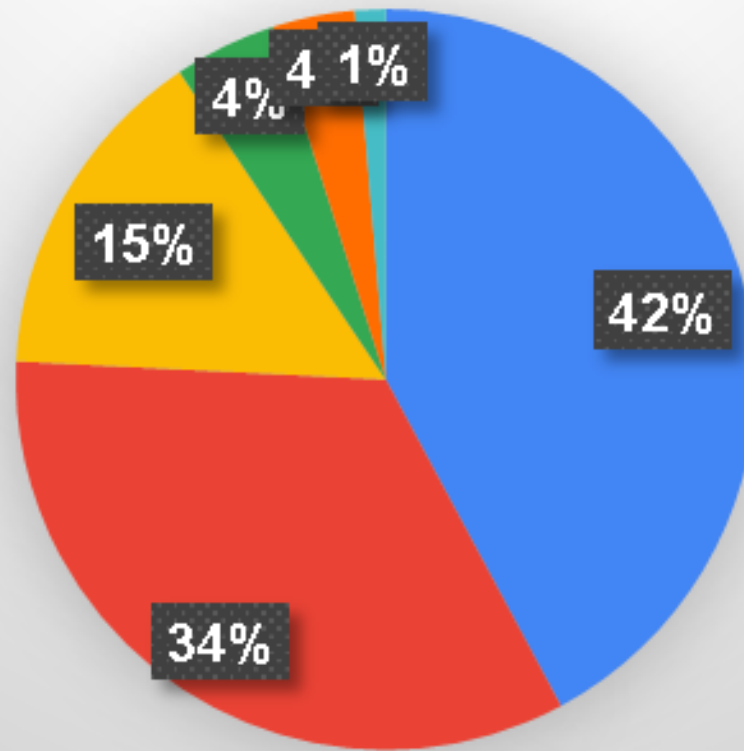
4. On average, how many white-tailed deer do you see on your property per week?

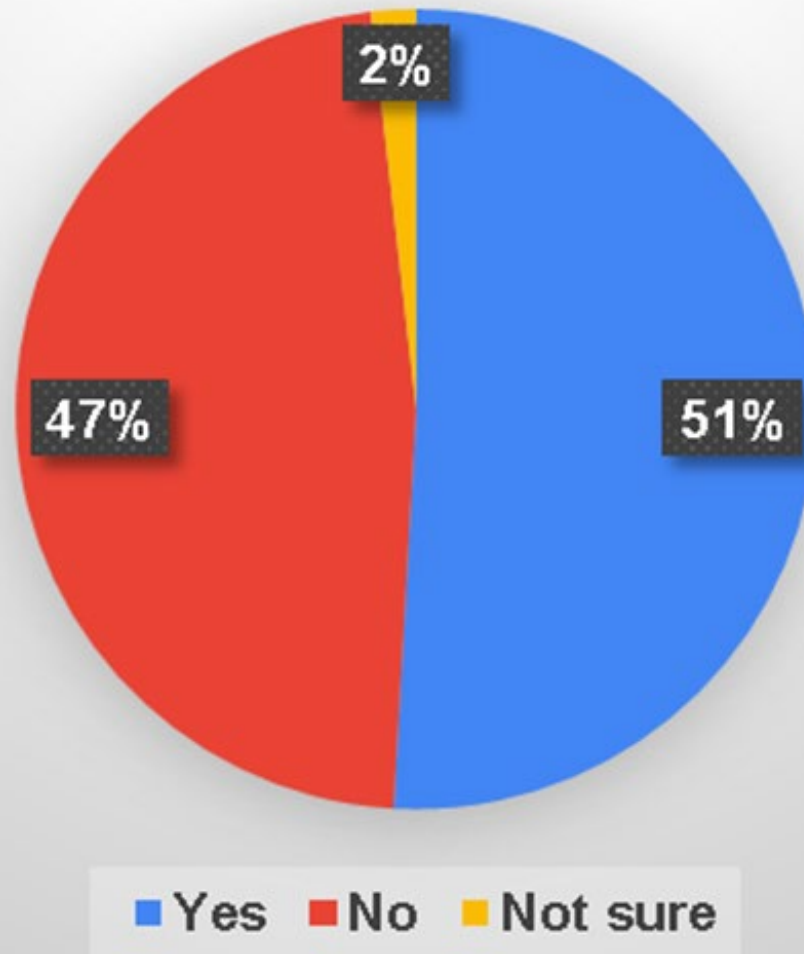
5. On average, how many Axis deer do you see on your property per week?

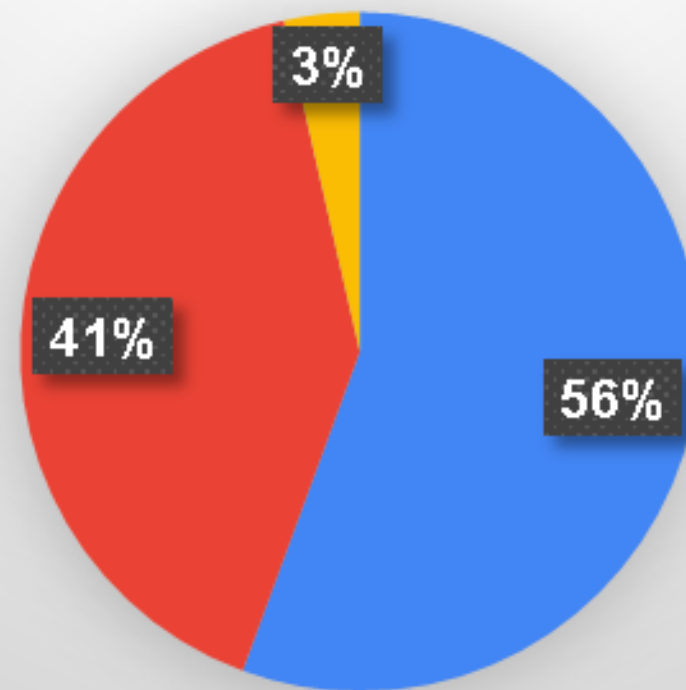
NOTE: This data also correlates to where deer are being FEED and/or near river!

NOTE: This data somewhat correlates to where deer are concentrated around feeding sights!

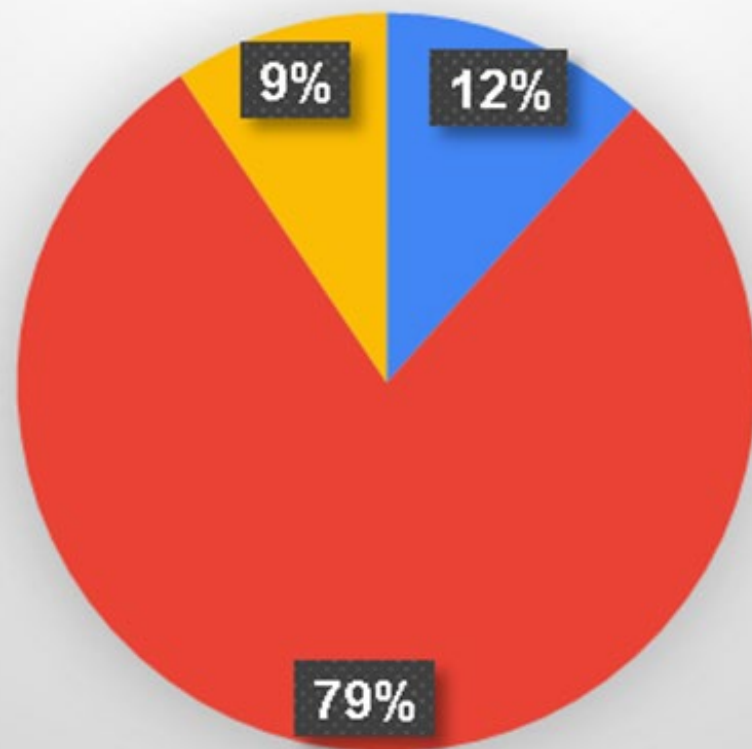
7. Have you ever used repellants, fencing, and/ or vegetation protection devices to prevent deer damage to your property?

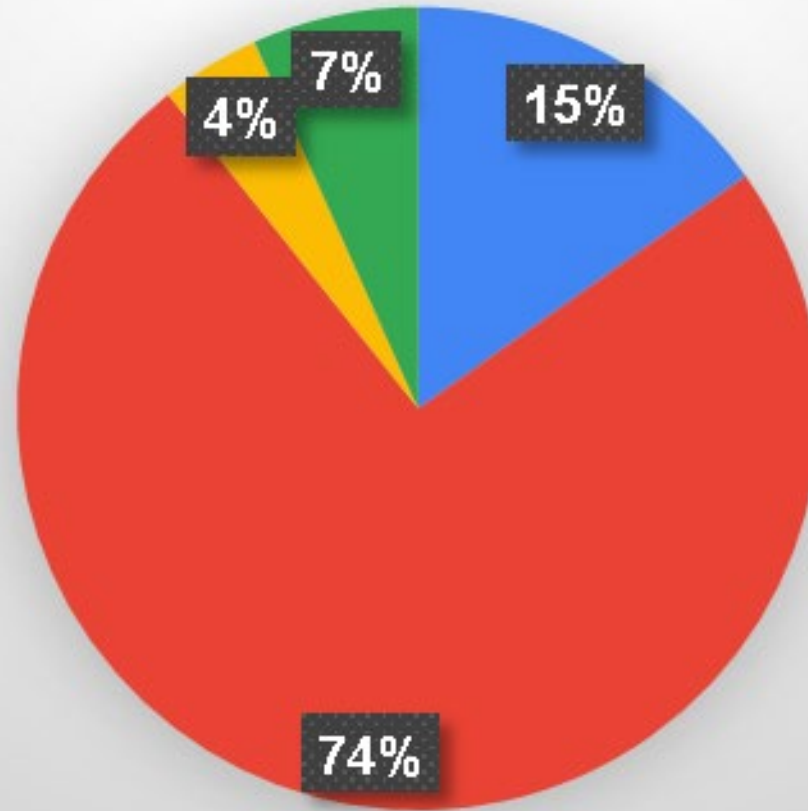


8. Have you or a member of your family been involved with a deer vehicle collision within River Crossing?

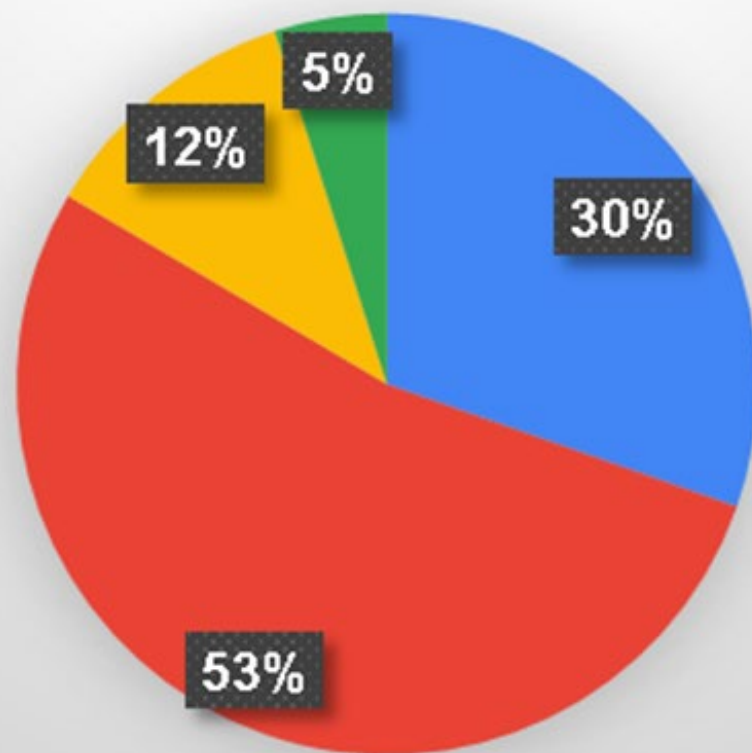
## 9. Have you seen any sick looking deer?

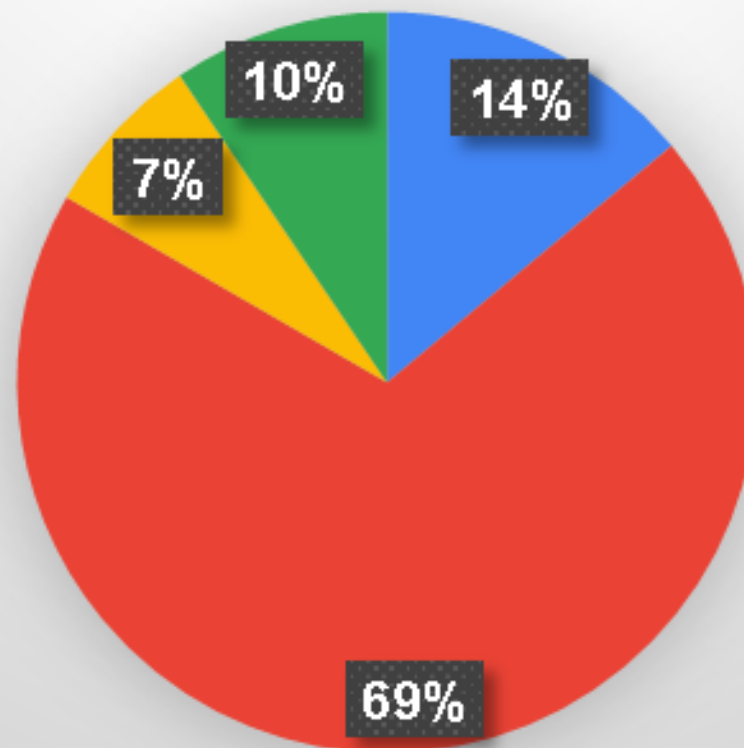

10. Do you believe there are too many white-tailed deer in River Crossing?



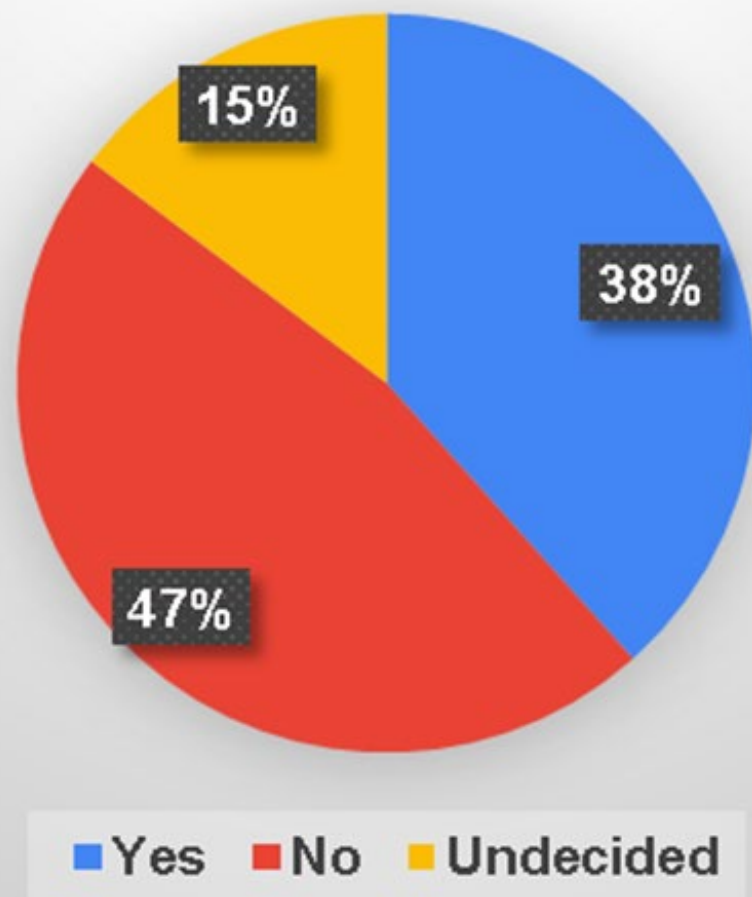

11. Do you believe there are too many exotic wildlife in River Crossing?

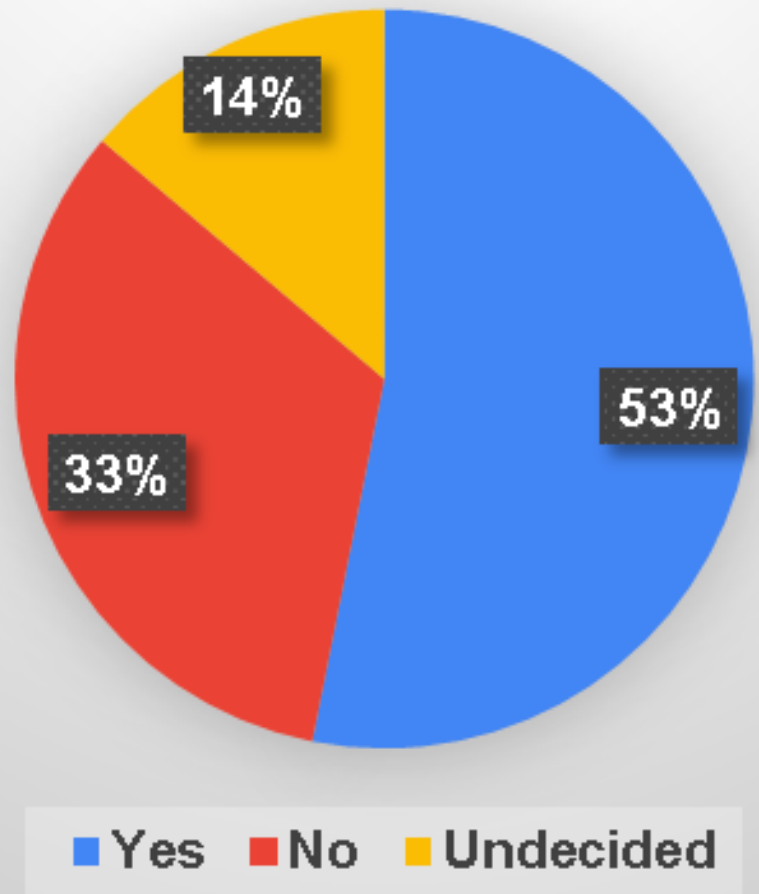

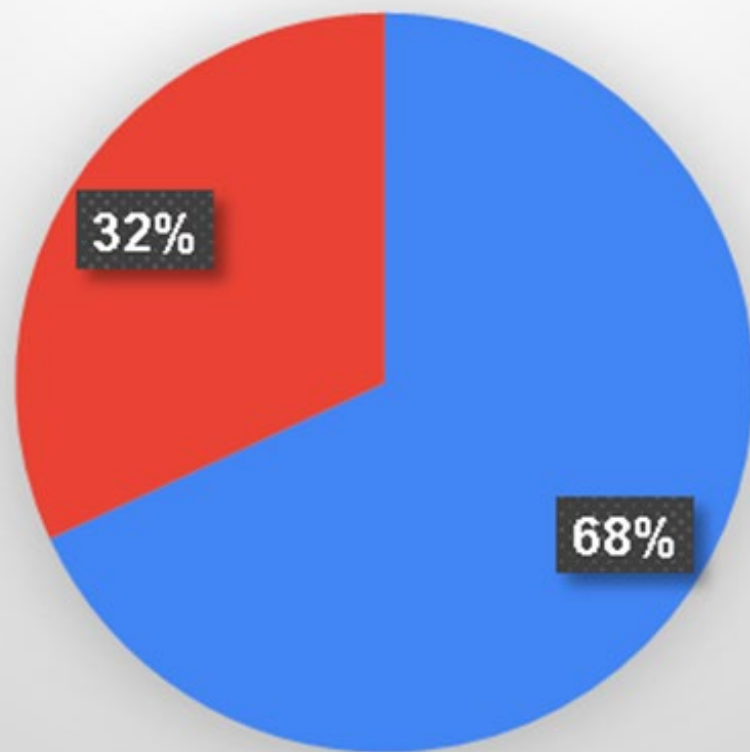
12. Would you support an ordinance which prohibits the feeding of deer in River Crossing?



13. Would you support an ordinance which prohibits the feeding of CORN in River Crossing?

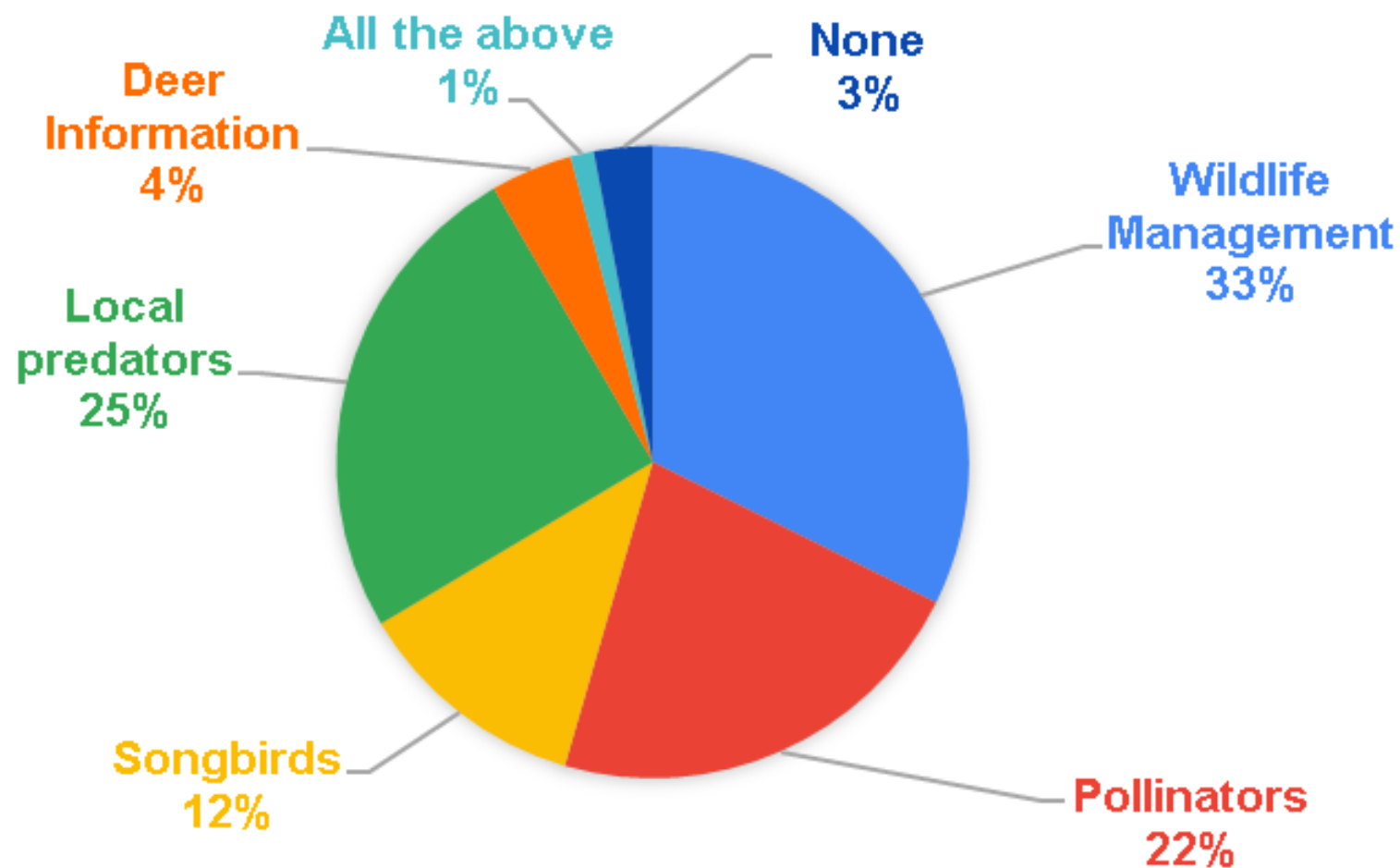


15. Would you support educational materials on planting quality deer browse in River Crossing?
